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- Balancing caring responsibilities with sustainable employment is a big factor, carers often sacrifice employment to deliver caring responsibilities, often 24/7.
- Carers don't know or fully understand their rights and this is a barrier to seeking employment.
- Lack of support networks hinders employability.
- Lack of awareness in the carer cohort regarding employment support for carers.
- Carers often find their caring history has impacted their academic advancement, this in turn impacts on qualifications and experience when applying for roles.
- Inconsistent employer support and lack of information in the workplace can cause carers to terminate employment.
- Larger employers tend to have more robust policies in place for carers.
- A lack of training for managers and awareness training for the general workforce leads to isolation and helplessness amongst employed carers.

### National Emergency Alert test to be held on 7th September

The UK government is testing the Emergency Alerts system on Sunday 7 September 2025 at 3pm.

Your mobile phone or tablet will vibrate and make a loud siren-like sound, even if it's set on silent.

The alert message will confirm this is a test and that you do not need to take any further action.

Regular testing ensures the system is functioning correctly, should it need to be used in a lifethreatening emergency.

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Thanks to Essex Carers funding, we are delighted to announce workshops for local, unpaid carers.

There are two weekly workshops; one for 8-15s and the other for 18+ specifically for unpaid carers held at Greenstead Community Centre.

Workshops take place every Monday between 5-6.30pm.

Sessions are free and designed for carers who may have never taken part in Drama sessions before.

As well as theatrical skills, our workshops develop communication, confidence, teamwork and leadership.



Workshops began in September 2024 and will run until March 2026 and participants will be entitled to a free space for the entire duration of the project.

At the end of the project, both groups will present pieces they have worked on to each other in a non-public celebration of work accomplished within the project for local, unpaid carers.
